


Demographic Challenges

- 5th fastest growing state will be the 7th largest (12+M) by 2030
- 78 rural counties and 22 urban counties
- 26 NC counties have fewer than 2 dentists/10K population
- NC ranks in the mid-30s in the number of providers/10K population – 4 counties have no dentist (Gates, Hyde, Jones & Tyrrell)






Our Students (Past & Present) Represent 88 North Carolina Counties








2015-2024 GraduatesPractice Counties









Keeping Student Debt Low: SODM Graduate Dental School Debt








Patients Treated by Provider January 1, 2024 – December 31, 2024











- Provided care for **165** Unique Patients Seen








ECU Smiles for Veterans

Making the Case for Special Needs

- Approximately 13-14% of North Carolinians have Special Needs
 - Utilization is less in the Special Needs Population with education/
 experience our graduates could provide a majority of the care in their offices
- We have a successful model (E, A, R) that we can build on
 - Starting in Greenville as a regional hub
 - Extending across the state
 - Focusing on rural and underserved areas
 - Fewer dentists more highly trained
- We know we can... and must do more
 - Making the case and getting people to listen
 - Planning process -- \$1M in legislative funding
